Through its five schools (Engineering and Architecture, Business, Social Work, Art and Design, and Music), Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts offers a broad spectrum of attractive courses. You can expect state-of-the-art infrastructure, a stimulating interdisciplinary environment and exceptional teaching staff. Over 3600 undergraduates and more than 1900 individuals in the professional development programmes benefit from the outstanding facilities provided on this attractive campus at the foot of Mount Pilatus, right on the shores of Lake Lucerne.

Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts is well networked with other universities and institutions both in Switzerland and abroad. The five schools – together with the Teacher-Training University of Central Switzerland and the University of Lucerne, both campus partners – collectively provide tertiary level courses and offer lectures and seminars combining elements from more than one school. School of Engineering and Architecture

Master of Science in Engineering (MSE)

The MSE offers highly motivated students the opportunity to pursue a comprehensive, specialised and strongly practice-oriented course of study, featuring outstanding researchers and lecturers who are fully dedicated to sharing their wide-ranging expertise in tackling complex tasks. The course is particularly known for its interdisciplinary research and development projects. The MSE at the Lucerne School of Engineering and Architecture is offered in cooperation with other universities of applied sciences in Switzerland. While the course as a whole is taught in German, some of the modules are conducted in English.

Lucerne School of Social Work

Master of Arts in International Community Development (MAICD)

The MAICD focuses on development work that promotes social cohesion and inclusion in the process of addressing issues such as poverty, economic development, housing, health, education and urban regeneration. It offers creative responses to difference and diversity, critical examination of policy and professional practice, and participatory approaches to working with local people who seek to improve their lives, their neighbourhood and their environment. The course promotes the view that local initiatives need to be placed within a global context and provides an interdisciplinary learning environment to develop knowledge and skills that can be applied in different countries with a variety of communities.

The course is offered in cooperation with the University of Westminster, London (UK).

Summer School International Community Development

The first two weeks of the Master programme in International Community Development can be booked separately as a short course. They take place in London and offer an introduction to various fields of interest in international community development.

Lucerne School of Music

Master of Arts in Music, Certificates of Advanced Studies

The Lucerne School of Music has originated from masterclasses which were taught every summer by the prestigious soloists of the world-famous Lucerne Festival. Eminent musicians such as Carl Flesch, Wolfgang Schneiderhahn, Edwin Fischer and others have thus created a tradition and spirit of music teaching which is nowadays still present in the Lucerne School of Music. The study programmes for the Bachelor of Arts in Music and for the Master of Arts in Music (classical music, jazz music and folk music) are taught in German. Teachers may agree to teach in a foreign language however; many of them of course speak English, French, Italian or other languages. Nevertheless, to follow the classes and to make contact with locals easier, you need a certain fluency in German (written and spoken). In English, the Lucerne School of Music offers to qualified students an interesting range of study programmes for Certificates of Advanced Studies as well as prestigious masterclasses. Every summer, the Lucerne School of Music offers a cooperation programme with the Lucerne Festival Academy.
