

**Costs for the Master of Science in Business Administration
Major Tourism**

2010/11 academic year

The following table provides an overview of the approximate outlay during the course and is intended as an aid in drawing up an individual costs. The figures are based on the ordinance on school fees (SRL 544) issued by the Canton of Lucerne. The university reserves the right to change its fees; all other figures are reference values.

²The amount shown is valid for students living in any canton in Switzerland except the Canton of Jura but including the Principality of Liechtenstein.

For all other students, the fees range from CHF 8,000 to CHF 30,000 per academic year. The fees are set on the basis of tariffs laid out in the Agreement on Universities of Applied Sciences. For the time being, Lucerne School of Business will assume these costs as part of a scholarship. These students will thus have the same status as those living in the Canton of Lucerne or in another canton that is subject to the agreement and their fees will amount to CHF 800 per semester.

Frequently asked questions concerning financial matters:

What are the costs for living?

The costs for living (including expenses for school, insurances, living, food, transportation, limited leisure activities etc.) range from CHF 20'000.- to 25'000.- per year.

Are there any student dormitories?

The school owns some student homes with sleeping rooms. You will have to apply for it and pay around CHF 500.- - 600.- per month. You might also find a flat together with two or three other students for about CHF 1'800.- - 2'200.- per month per flat.

Am I allowed to work in Switzerland with a students' visa?

Yes, you are. EU-nationals can work up to 30% of a normal workload from the first day on. Non-EU-nationals can work from the seventh month onwards.

Is it possible to find work without speaking German?

Some of our non-native-German students were successful in finding a job without major German knowledge. However, it is not easy to find something. If you find a job, you can expect a salary of about CHF 500.- - CHF 1000.- per month when working 30% of a normal workload.
