The HSLU is the university of applied sciences of the six cantons in Central Switzerland. With its 8,300 students at six Schools, 5,000 participants in CAS, DAS and MAS programmes and some 350 new research projects, it is the largest educational institution in the heart of Switzerland. In 2022, its turnover was CHF 316 million.



# Move and keep moving

Dear reader,

Since its founding 25 years ago, the Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts (HSLU) has become a driving force and a major service partner in Central Switzerland. The practical relevance of our education and continuing education programmes and of our research and development activities is a crucial success factor. This is also borne out by the results of the 2023 Swiss Education Report, which show that the HSLU has the second-highest rate of graduates working in positions commensurate with their training. It confirms that we teach knowledge and skills that are highly relevant to the labour market.

The HSLU's attractiveness as a place of study is also evident in the fact that more young people from outside the contributing cantons study with us than the other way round. After graduation, many remain here as sought-after specialists in the region's workforce.

As a university-level institution, we aim to move our environment and ourselves with it. We do this by reading the pulse of both the economy and of society, by helping to address social change in Central Switzerland and by contributing to the region's appeal as a place to live and do business. In a project commissioned by the six contributing cantons to counteract the skills shortage in Central Switzerland, the HSLU and the XUND healthcare education centre have teamed up to evaluate the introduction of university-level education and continuing education programmes for the care and medical engineering/life sciences sectors.

While the 2022 anniversary year brought us many wonderful things, it was also marked by the effects of the Ukraine war. The HSLU provided a safe place to live and study for some 40 students at short notice. Soaring energy prices also forced us to consider our energy consumption as an institution and to introduce additional measures to reduce it.

In 2022, there was a great deal of movement in our "HSLU Alumni" network. The HSLU's graduates, lecturers, current students and participants in continuing and executive education programmes can now join the network via the <a href="https://hslu-alumni.ch">hslu-alumni.ch</a> platform and continue to cultivate contacts after completing their studies.

Education and continuing education are about so much more than just knowledge acquisition; they form networks capable of reaching far beyond the HSLU and of making a difference on multiple levels. Without these connections and the commitment of the many actors involved – specifically, our six contributing cantons – our successes would not have been possible. Thank you!

# More than 8,000 students



In 2022, 6,477 students were enrolled in a bachelor's and 1,799 in a master's programme at one of the six Schools. Engineering and Architecture, Business, and Information Technology accounted for roughly 71 % of the students. Women made up 46 % . 2,006 students received their graduation certificate. The Schools offer a total of 39 bachelor's and 21 master's programmes as well as one diploma degree programme.

#### Students by origin



## **Continuing and Executive Education**

# A leading university of applied sciences in continuing education



1,033 participants are enrolled in a Master of Advanced Studies (MAS) programme, while 3,966 study for a diploma or a Certificate of Advanced Studies (DAS/CAS). In total, 4,999 people were enrolled in a CAS, DAS or MAS programme. An additional 7,725 people attended a continuing education specialist course or seminar.

# A highly valued research and service partner

In 2022, 348 research and development projects were initiated. Among the notable external funders were Innosuisse, the Swiss National Science Foundation SNSF, the Federal Government and a range of EU programmes. 280 new research projects were launched with the help of external funding from partners in Switzerland and abroad. The revenue generated through research was roughly CHF 65 million.





The Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts is active in the four mandated areas of activity that are education, continuing and executive education, research and development, and services. Education was the most important source of revenue. Revenue generated from room rental and IT services for third parties cannot be attributed to a specific area of mandated activity.

#### **Funding**



The Swiss Confederation funds the Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts with basic contributions for education programmes and research funding (Innosuisse, Swiss National Science Foundation SNSF). The Intercantonal Agreement financing encompasses contributions for bachelor's and master's students residing in the six contributing cantons (14%) and the Intercantonal Agreement residual funding (14%).
