### Cost overview for the BSc Immersive Technologies

The table below provides a general overview of the costs involved in studying for a bachelor's degree at the Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts and may thus be of use to prospective students.

The fees are based on the corresponding regulations of the Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts.<sup>1</sup>

Please note that fees may be subject to change and that non-fee figures should be taken as approximations only.

- Admission fees are invoiced directly after registration and cannot be refunded in case of an application withdrawal.
- Tuition fees per semester must be paid in full by all students who are registered at the beginning of the semesters. These fees are also owed in case of deregistration after the start of the semester (even if no classes have been attended).

<sup>2</sup> In addition to the federal government, the cantons also contribute to the cost of studying with so-called FHV contributions. However, they do not pay any contributions for foreign students who enter Switzerland for the purpose of studying. Therefore, students who have their legal domicile abroad at the time of enrollment, pay CHF 500 more per semester than domestic students, i.e. CHF 1300 instead of CHF 800. This applies for the entire duration of the course of study.

<sup>3</sup> Maximum of CHF 360 for the entire duration of the studies, regardless of the number of semesters.

<sup>4</sup> Module examination fees are also due during exchange semesters. Maximum of CHF 900 for the entire duration of the studies, regardless of the number of semesters
