The table below provides an overview of the approximate expenses during your studies and may thus be of use to prospective students in working out a realistic personal budget.

The fees are based on the corresponding regulations of the Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts<sup>1</sup>. Please note that fees may be subject to change and that non-fee figures should be taken as approximations only.

- The application fee is charged at the time of registration. In case of a possible cancellation this will not be refunded.
- Tuition fees per semester must be paid in full by all students who are registered at the beginning of the semester concerned. Such fees are also owed in case of deregistration after the start of the semester (even if no classes have been attended).

To make sure that tuition fees for foreign students are, nevertheless, not much higher than for students with Swiss citizenship, the Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts covers part of the difference. The rest is paid by foreign students with an additional semester fee of CHF 500 (i.e. they pay CHF 1'300.00/semester)
