

Master's Thesis Excellence Award Regulations

MSc Business Administration, Major People Management and Organisation

- 1. The jury exclusively recognizes Master's theses written at the Lucerne School of Business in the MSc Business Administration, Major People Management and Organisation programme.
- 2. Participants are presumed to be familiar with and consent to these regulations.
- 3. A minimum mark of 5.5 must have been awarded for the theses submitted.
- 4. The thesis must be submitted in its original and graded form.
- 5. The thesis submitted must be accompanied by a concise written statement from the Supervisor and Co-Supervisor of the Master Thesis.
- All nominations must be made <u>before</u> Calendar Week 27 (End Date Spring Semester) /
 Calendar Week 05 (End Date Autumn Semester), complete with the required appendices, by e-mail in one single pdf-file (master.business@hslu.ch).
- 7. Submissions must include the following details which must be filled out in a standard form (separate file):
 - Name, phone number, e-mail address
 - Title of the thesis along with the awarded grade
 - Names and titles, telephone numbers, and email addresses of the thesis supervisor and co-supervisor.
- 8. The submission must include the following appendices:
 - A letter of recommendation, stating why the thesis meets the criteria of academic excellence, originality and practical benefit.
 - A summary of the thesis of max. 2 A4 pages, written by the student and that is comprehensible to a general audience either in German or in English.
 - A curriculum vitae for the nominated candidate of max. 2 A4.
- 9. Nominations will not be returned to the sender.
- 10. The nomination must be written in German or in English.
- 11. The jury may deviate from the above if a substantiated request is submitted to that effect.
- 12. The jury will review the nominations and shortlist up to four candidates, including the winner.



- 13. Submissions are evaluated based on their academic excellence, originality, and their understanding of the practical benefit.
- 14. The winner will receive an award which consists of a certificate and CHF 1,000.
- 15. The jury's decision is final, and no correspondence will be held regarding it.
- 16. The results will be announced during the diploma ceremonies in February and September. The results will be published on the HSLU-website.
- 17. All cases not covered by these regulations will be at the discretion of the jury.
- 18. By participating in this process, nominees' consent to the following:
 - the submitted theses will be accessible to and read by members of the central administration team, members of the jury and potentially future members of the jury.
 - the details of participants, as entered into the standard form, will be processed by the central administration team to facilitate the selection procedure.
 - submitted theses will be retained for future reference for a maximum of 3 years following the announcement of the award.
