Guideline language certificate C1 level of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR)

The official language in the Bachelor Programme in International Business Administration is English. This does not only apply to the actual courses, but to all communication between the university and its students, starting with enrolment and ranging across course-related administrative processes right through to graduation. Students registering with the School of Business must therefore have an excellent command of the English language and must be able to express themselves in this language fluently and accurately. They are, for example, expected to be able to correctly read, understand, interpret and discuss discipline-specific specialised texts both orally and in writing.

Proof of sufficient English-language skills must be submitted in the form of a recognized language certificate at level C1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. The following test results are considered as minimal prerequisites for successful coursework.
